Sir Peter Hall will receive the fifth Happold Medal award after delivering the lecture on "Sustainable City Planning" on Tuesday 27th November 2007 at 7.00pm at the Royal Aeronautical Society, No 4 Hamilton Place in London.

Sir Peter Hall is Professor of Planning at the Bartlett School of Architecture and Planning, University College London and President of the Town and Country Planning Association. He is also an internationally renowned authority on the economic, demographic, cultural and management issues that face cities around the globe.
